

(1) Standards for determining the exact dimensions and locations of such easements;

(2) Restrictions on vegetation, buildings and other objects which could obstruct the passage of sunlight or wind through such easements;

(3) Terms or conditions, if any, under which an easement may be revised or terminated; and

(4) Considerations of cost, feasibility, contour, and configuration of the parcels or units to be subdivided.

(c) Such an easement shall not result in reducing allowable densities on any segment of a parcel or unit of a subdivision which may be occupied by a building or other structure already constructed, or presently under construction, on the effective date of this chapter.

Section 2. Title 29, section 275, Virgin Islands Code, is amended by adding a new subsection "(e)" to read as follows:

(e) Subdivision plans required under this chapter must comply with the provisions of Title 28, section 1006, Virgin Islands Code.

To Rename the St. Thomas Airport for Former Governor  
Cyril E. King.

WHEREAS Cyril E. King was born on April 7, 1921, on the island of St. Croix; and

WHEREAS Cyril E. King attended St. Ann's Catholic School at Barren Spot and was graduated by St. Mary's Catholic School in Christiansted, St. Croix; and

WHEREAS in 1947 Cyril E. King entered American University in Washington, D.C., where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Public Administration and later completed extensive graduate work in the fields of government, public administration and political science; and

WHEREAS in 1949 he was appointed an aide to Senator Hubert Humphrey of Minnesota and was the first Black to serve on the staff of a United States Senator; and

WHEREAS in 1961 Cyril E. King was appointed Government Secretary, a post equivalent to the present position of Lieutenant Governor, by President John F. Kennedy; and

WHEREAS in 1969, he became Acting Governor for four months after Governor Ralph M. Paiewonsky's resignation was accepted by President Richard M. Nixon; and

WHEREAS in 1972 he was elected to the Virgin Islands Senate from the District of St. Thomas-St. John; and

WHEREAS Cyril Emmanuel King was elected the second Governor of the U.S. Virgin Islands in a run-off election on November 19, 1974; and

WHEREAS Governor King died on January 2, 1978, after many years of faithful and dedicated service to the people of the Virgin Islands; and

WHEREAS it is fitting and proper that the Legislature memorialize the service and dedication of one of its native sons, Cyril E. King, by renaming the Harry S. Truman Airport on the island of St. Thomas in his honor; Now, Therefore,

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Virgin Islands:*

**Section 1.** The Harry S. Truman Airport on the island of St. Thomas is hereby renamed the Cyril E. King Airport.

**Section 2.** The Virgin Islands Port Authority shall provide a suitable plaque bearing the name of the airport, which plaque shall be affixed at the entrance of the "Cyril E. King Airport".

**Section 3.** A permanent plaque copy of this act shall be prepared and presented to Mrs. Agnes King by the President of the Legislature or his designee at an appropriate ceremony to be held for that purpose.
